INCOME FROM SCHOOL PROGRAMS

Through certain academic activities, students provide goods and services at a charge to the public. The services and products provided are designed for educational purposes, however, and are not designed or intended to be competitive with local businesses or to produce revenue for the district. Any proceeds from these activities may be expended for educational purposes approved by the building administrator.

For example:

- Visitations to other schools to broaden student experiences in related learning activities.
- Visitations to places of manufacturing and/or retailing of related goods or services in order to gain insights into actual operations.
- Attendance at state or national meetings, conferences, or conventions held by state or national organizations.
- Reimbursement of expenses and recovery of costs incurred during local activities or operations while producing the goods and services.

Money received will be turned in to the school office for deposit in a designated account. Money received for repairs in school facilities will be placed in a separate account for that purpose.
