COOPERATIVE EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMMING REGULATION

It is the policy of the Laconia School Board that District schools will attempt to provide special or extended services to students residing within any of the other member towns. The Laconia Board has identified the following regulations to assist District schools in this process. The regulations include, but are not limited to the following:

STUDENT PLACEMENT REGULATIONS

- Each high school must advise the other of courses/activities available for exchange placement at least three school months in advance.
- Both schools must present a list of exchange placement candidates at least two school months before the beginning of classes.
- The candidate for placement must have the approval of parents, guidance personnel from both schools, and both principals.
- The school may return the exchange student to the home school at the discretion of the Principal of the receiving school.

FACULTY EXCHANGE REGULATIONS

- When exchange placement students constitute more than 50 percent of the receiving school's enrollment in a given class, the sending school will pay teacher expenses for that class salary and fringe benefits.
- When the event described above occurs, the teacher will be invited to move the location of his or her class to the sending school. Whether or not this is done is at the discretion of the teacher.
- If a teacher teaches in both high schools, he or she will be under the negotiated agreement of the District where more than half of his or her assignment is located.
- If the previous statement occurs, the teacher will be subject to the administrative authority and School Board regulations of the same district as well.
